Also, if school populations decrease by more than 2 percent, revenues decrease by more than 2 percent, and if vacancy rates increase by more than 2 percent, that would constitute a significant impact. A significant impact on environmental justice would occur if a disproportionate amount of minority and/or low-income populations were adversely affected by the project.
